Criteria for membership

- Any organisation whether unincorporated or incorporated can apply for membership. They must be identifiable as a third sector organisation that works in Highland.
- Individuals need to be aged 16 or over, clearly identify a strong link to the third sector, and be clear why you are unable to join under an organisation.

Member Responsibilities

- Put forward nominees for third sector representation.
- Participate in forums, focus groups and consultations.
- Organisational members will be asked to nominate an individual to act on their behalf to vote on behalf of the organisation at HTSI General Meetings.



Those ineligible to be members

- Employees, Board members or nominees of Partner organisations will not be eligible for membership.
- Any employee of HTSI or any person seconded to HTSI may not be nominated by an organisation to represent it for voting.

Members can be any and all third sector organisations in Highland.
